SCHOOL BUS SAFETY WEEK SERVES AS REMINDER TO DRIVE CAREFULLY

DRIPPING SPRINGS, Texas—This week is being recognized as National School Bus Safety Week and Dripping Springs ISD asks all drivers to join the effort to provide a safe environment for bus riders by observing school bus laws and displaying courtesy to buses and bus riders.

National School Bus Safety Week is an active and evolving public education program and an excellent way for parents, students, teachers, motorists, school bus operators, school administrators, and other interested parties to join forces and address the importance of school bus safety. Dripping Springs ISD drivers transport approximately 2,300 students between home and school each day, and buses collectively drive more than 4,000 miles each day.

"Our department is strongly committed to safely and efficiently transporting our students every day," said Director of Transportation Pam Swanks. "It is critical that drivers of other cars and other vehicles are cautious and aware at all times, and follow the law when approaching school buses or bus stops."
