CITIZENS' BOND STEERING COMMITTEE

MEETING #2 RECAP

The Citizens' Bond Steering Committee (CBSC) held its second meeting on June 15, 2022, in the Dripping Springs Elementary Center for Learning and Innovation. The CBSC takes the work of the Long-Range Facility Planning Committee and develops a recommendation for a bond package for consideration by the DSISD Board of Trustees.

After committee members toured the DSE campus, Superintendent Dr. Holly Morris-Kuentz began the meeting by answering committee questions from the previous meeting. Dr. Morris-Kuentz discussed community survey results and community meeting participation regarding the Long-Range Facility Planning Committee's recommendations, the status of land purchases, and the plan for unspent funds from the 2018 bond.

Dr. Stacey Tepera of Population and Survey Analysts (PASA) presented on DSISD's demographics and growth projections. Dr. Tepera covered annual growth rates, economic trends, projected housing occupancies, student growth projections, and a summary of needed campuses to accommodate the growth over the next 10 years.

Director of Facilities and Construction Clint Pruett next outlined prioritized potential campus and district bond projects based on a 1-4 scale with projects listed as a "1" needing to be addressed sooner rather than later.
