

## 2017-2018 Season Summary

11/15	@ San Marcos	<p><b>DSHS 45 San Marcos 33</b></p> <p>The Tigers begin their season with a win. Newcomers Justin Durham and Trent Greenman secure varsity wins. Blake Spillar seals the deal with a fall.</p> <p>Dual Record: 1-0</p>
12/1-2	Capital Classic	<p>The Tigers come away from the Cap Classic with a sole medalist for the second year in a row. Clayton Jetton gets to the finals with a major, pin, pin, and meets what will become a familiar opponent from Georgetown in the finals, where he picks up a 4-3 decision. The third place finisher in his bracket is the eventual 5A state champ.</p> <p>Team Place: 24<sup>th</sup> out of 63</p>
12/6	vs. Lake Travis & Round Rock McNeil	<p><b>DSHS 71 RR McNeil 6; DSHS 45 Lake Travis 25</b></p> <p>Of their 9 wins against McNeil, all are falls, which is, for the time, probably the largest dual victory margin in school history. Most notably, Crystian Zamora comes alive in the second period to secure a pin while down 5-0, and Cody Barron makes his varsity debut with a fall. Against LT, the Tigers win 8 of 12 matches, highlighted by Ryland's decision of an eventual 6A state qualifier and Lukey's quick first period pin to go 2-0 on his first night in the maroon and gold.</p> <p>Dual Record: 3-0</p>
12/9	Georgetown Throwdown	<p><b>DSHS 40 Georgetown 30; DSHS 56 Leander 20; DSHS 30 Vandegrift 45; DSHS 68 Austin Bowie 12</b></p> <p>The Tigers go 3-1 on the day, win a solid pool to advance to the final four, drop a tough semi to eventual 6A regional champs Vandegrift, and annihilate the 6A regional runner-up Bowie. Highlights include Ben nearly pinning a former state finalist from Leander, Chase punking one of Leander's best dudes on a weight bump, and Micah losing 3-4 to an eventual 6A state champ.</p> <p>Team Place: 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 12      Dual Record: 6-1</p>
12/16	Hill Country Invitational	<p>The Tigers outscore all of the best teams from the region except Vandegrift to finish 2<sup>nd</sup> and add a pretty sweet trophy to the case. Four Tigers bring home gold. Kevin pins four guys at 285.5. Clayton get four falls and a decision for the gold at 182. Ryland gets 5 Ws en route to gold, including a decisive win over an eventual 5A state placer. Chase also wins five matches, his final being a major decision over a 6A placer.</p> <p>Team Place: 2<sup>nd</sup> out of 21</p>
12/22-23	Texas Outlaw	<p>Ten Tigers venture to possibly the toughest tourney in the state during the Christmas break to get some solid competition. Ryland wins 6 straight matches before dropping his first match of the season in the semis; he finishes with a 6<sup>th</sup> place podium finish. Micah goes 5-3 to finish 5<sup>th</sup> and get on the podium, beating a 6A state qualifier along the way. Ben bombs some dudes on his way to a 5-2 record and 4<sup>th</sup> place finish. Chase pins 4, drops the semi against an Allen wrestler, his first loss of the season, and finishes with 2 more pins, the last against a 6A state placer, to get the bronze. Clayton rattles off five wins to reach the finals before losing a decision in the finals to an eventual 6A placer. The team is the top 5A finisher.</p> <p>Team Place: 10<sup>th</sup> out of 28</p>
1/5-6	CFISD	<p>At the biggest tourney in the state, two Tigers reach the podium. Ryland beats a 6A qualifier and a 5A placer on his way to an 8<sup>th</sup> place finish. Chase goes 5-1 en route to a 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish, his only loss coming to the eventual 6A runner-up. Other highlights include Tony and Nick getting big wins over solid Houston Westside wrestlers and Luke picking up a big win in extra overtimes.</p> <p>Team Place: 16<sup>th</sup> out of 84</p>

1/10	Cedar Park Quad	<p><b>DSHS 39 Cedar Park 36; DSHS 41 Leander 34; DSHS 66 Georgetown Eastview 9</b></p> <p>It becomes clear that Cedar Park is the new district rival when the Tigers barely pick up the W at CP. Big wins come from Ryland and Nick, Ben gets a pin in 19 seconds, Ryon and Clayton also get pins, and Adam rejoins the varsity lineup with a big pin of his own. Against Leander, Brodie get the dual started with an exciting overtime win, and big boys Anthony and Colby go headlock and cement job to seal the dual. In the Eastview dual, Nick dethrones Ben from the top of the fast pin podium, picking up an 18-second fall.</p> <p>Dual Record: 9-1</p>
1/13	5A State Duals	<p><b>DSHS 51 El Paso Chapin 9; DSHS 42 Fort Worth Chisholm Trail 37; DSHS 40 Highland Park 36; DSHS 36 Carrollton Creekview 48; DSHS 33 Canyon Randall 42</b></p> <p>The Tigers travel over 1000 miles round trip in search of some new competition and a little state duals glory. The day starts with the Tigers thumping El Paso Chapin. Versus Chisholm Trail, six guys pick up falls, including Anthony, who bumps up a weight and headlocks a highly ranked opponent to seal the dual. Needing a win to advance to the state semifinals, the Tigers come through as a team once again. It comes down to the last match, and Brodie Dyer bombs a guy for the win. The semifinal dual is also a close one, highlighted by pins from Ben, Nick, and Luke, but the final match swings the dual in Creekview's favor. In the third place match, the guys keep it close with Canyon Randall but settle for 4<sup>th</sup>. Team Place: 4<sup>th</sup> out of 16 Dual Record: 12-3</p>
1/19-20	Ranger Classic	<p>The team heads back to Dallas for one final trip out of town before the state tournament. Clayton goes 4-1 to claim bronze, losing a match he will later avenge. Ryland makes the bump to 170 for the rest of year and looks great; he also goes 4-1 to claim bronze. Nick goes 4-2 with 4 pins and falls one match short of the 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> bout. Without a doubt, though, this weekend is the Ben Owens Show. Ben gets two pins and a major to reach the finals, and in the finals he manhandles an Oklahoma kid with only one loss and picks up the fall.</p> <p>Team Place: 6<sup>th</sup> out of 25</p>
1/24	vs. Georgetown	<p><b>DSHS 48 Georgetown 21</b></p> <p>On Senior Night, facing a Georgetown team that won a tournament the Saturday before and kept the dual close back in December, the Tigers leave no doubt. Cody about breaks a guy's back, Brodie and Nick sneak away with close ones, Chase does Chase things, and seniors Adam, Anthony, and Ryland get pins.</p> <p>Dual Record: 13-3</p>
1/27	District 13-5A Duals	<p><b>DSHS 78 Georgetown Eastview 0; DSHS 69 Pflugerville Weiss 3; DSHS 54 Leander Rouse 22; DSHS 49 Georgetown 19</b></p> <p>The Tigers smash their way through the first ever District 13 Duals, which is also the first tournament ever hosted at DSHS. The guys hand Eastview a donut, which is a program first. Brodie, Chase, Nick, Ryland, and Colby are undefeated on the day, and Brodie and Ben get big revenge Ws over tough district opponents. Colby claims his spot atop the fast pin podium for this season with a fall in 15 seconds.</p> <p>Team Place: 1<sup>st</sup> out of 10 Dual Record: 18-3</p>
1/31	@ Westlake	<p><b>DSHS 46 Westlake 30</b></p> <p>The dual season is wrapped up with a win over Westlake, the team that placed 5<sup>th</sup> at 6A Dual State. The team's 19-3 record is a program best. The Tigers finish the year as the best 5A dual team in the region, second only to Vandegrift in 6A.</p> <p><b>Final Dual Record: 19-3</b></p>

2/10	District 13-5A Championships	<p>Unlike last season, the Tigers head into the district tournament projected to take second place, but the guys come through big time and outdistance Cedar Park by 14 team points to repeat as district champs. Adam, Ben, and Clayton outperform their seeds in the bracket. Ten of the twelve guys entered qualify for regionals, seven reach the finals (Brodie, Adam, Ryon, Ben, Chase, Ryland, and Clayton), and Chase, Ryland, and Clayton are district champions. Chase is voted the tournament's most outstanding wrestler.</p> <p>Team Place: 1<sup>st</sup> out of 10</p>
2/16-17	Region 4-5A Championships	<p>Ten Tigers head to the Delco looking to qualify for state and extend their season one more week. Colby drops his first two matches finishes his first varsity season as a regional qualifier. Tony goes 2-2 with a pin and a tech but doesn't make it out of the weekend. Ryon smashes his first opponent, drops his second match, wins two more, and finishes up 6<sup>th</sup>, barely missing out on a challenge match. He and Tony both show a lot of heart and guts fighting through the season despite needing surgery on their shoulders. Brodie battles his way to a 5<sup>th</sup> place finish, drops his challenge match to a familiar foe from Hutto, and is a state alternate for the second year in a row. After dropping his first match by a point, Adam picks up 4 wins on the back to take 5<sup>th</sup> and finish up as a state alternate. Ben picks up four pins in the tournament, including in his 5<sup>th</sup> place match, but he misses out on a challenge when his consol semi opponent injury defaults in the bronze match; he goes to state as an alternate. Nick wins two, drops his semifinal, and wins two more to take third, handling the guy he lost to at district and stamping his ticket to Houston. Clayton goes 4-1, his sole loss a 4-3 decision in the second round; he takes third and qualifies once again. Ryland pins his first two opponents, picks up a solid decision in the semis, and wins probably the most exciting final of the night in extra overtimes with a clutch reversal. Chase get three pins followed by a major in the finals and is voted the co-MOW. Ey! The Tenacious Ten combine forces to win the first ever regional championship in DSHS wrestling history!</p> <p>Team Place: 1<sup>st</sup> out of 38</p>
2/23-24	5A State Championships	<p>Back at the Berry Center, the Four Horsemen fight for a spot atop the podium. Nick's first opponent is a guy who majored him at the state duals, but Nick gets the first takedown this time and keeps the match close deep into the third. In his consolation bout, he falls 4-5. His first opponent reaches the podium and the second the round of 8. In his first trip to State, Nick shows that he can compete at a high level, not just qualify. Ryland wins a nail-biter in the opening round with a last-second takedown, drops his quarterfinal match the eventual runner-up, handles his regional finals opponent the second time around, and drops a close one in the round of 8. He finishes his career with the second most career wins in school history and is just the third Tiger to qualify for the state meet three times. Clayton avenges his loss from the Ranger Classic in the first round, drops his quarterfinal, and rattles off three solid wins to claim the bronze and improve on his 6<sup>th</sup> place finish from last season. He joins Luke and Ryland in the Century Club and will be back from more next season. Chase sticks his first opponent, about rips the arms off his second on the way to a tech, blanks his semifinal opponent and nearly get a major, and drops the finals match to a returning state champ and the 5A MOW. He is just the third Tiger to reach the state finals and still has two years to go.</p> <p>Team Place: 14<sup>th</sup> out of 90</p>
