11/14	Clemens & San Marcos	DSHS 70 Schertz Clemens 6; DSHS 36 San Marcos 42 The Tigers start their season with a dominant win over Clemens and then drop a close dual to San Marcos. Tony is the only guy to get a match in both duals and win both of them. Lauryn, Cat, and Alyson all pick up pins versus Clemens to debut the girls' team in style. Dual Record: 1-1
11/16	Cinco Tri	DSHS 40 Cypress Woods 37; DSHS 19 Cinco Ranch 49 The guys squeak out a close dual versus Cy-Woods thanks to three consecutive pins at the end of the lineup from Justin, Clayton, and Christian. Then they take a bit of a beating from Cinco Ranch. Tony picks up a pin over an eventual 6A state qualifier versus Cy-Woods, and Crystian collects pins in both his matches. Dual Record: 2-2
11/17	Big 12	The Tigers travel all the way to Katy for their first tournament of the year and find some good matches. Clayton throws three guys all over the mat and pins his way through the bracket. Brodie, Justin, and Christian all finish 4 th . Tony fails to place but looks promising as he holds an eventual Louisiana state runner-up to a decision and loses by a point to an 5A state placer. Boys Team Place: 7 th out of 12
11/28	SA Roosevelt	DSHS 48 SA Roosevelt 27 Brodie, Micah, Daniel, Tony, and Luke all get pins to help push the Tigers to a win versus Roosevelt. Clayton and the eventual 6A state champ mix it up in the main event, which goes Roosevelt's way by decision. Dual Record: 3-2
11/30-12/1	Capital Classic	In the first of many trips to the Delco, the Tigers have a solid team showing, nearly bringing home a team trophy. Crystian goes 3-2; Brodie and Luke go 4-2; Micah avenges a loss from the Big 12 and takes out a 6A qualifier on his way to a 4 th place finish; Tony makes it into the finals and finishes 2 nd to an eventual 5A state champ; Clayton also takes 2 nd , dropping a decision in the finals to the eventual 6A state champ. On the girls side, Cat goes 2-2 and Alyson goes 3-2, pinning a 6A state qualifier along the way. Boys Team Place: 3 rd out of 38
12/5	@ Lake Travis	DSHS 34 Lake Travis 39 The guys drop a close dual to that team from up north when all the close matches go the other team's way. Cat Miller picks up a quick fall in the first match between girls in the rivalry. Dual Record: 3-3
12/8	Georgetown Throwdown	DSHS 51 Bowie 24; DSHS 47 Hutto 30; DSHS 67 Hendrickson 6; DSHS 39 Lake Travis 33; DSHS 12 Vandegrift 67 After picking up wins in their first three duals (highlighted by Matthew squeaking out a 1-0 win over Bowie, Clay picking up his first varsity pin versus Hutto, and Micah smashing an eventual 5A qualifier from Hutto), the guys redeem themselves versus LT to make it into the finals and claim a team trophy. Micah and Matthew pick up important, close matches in the dual; Crystian and JJ dominate; Brodie seals it with a pin. Matthew and Clayton both pick up falls in the finals. Team Place: 2 nd out of 10 Dual Record: 7-4

12/8	AISD Girls Invitational	Cat brings home the gold when she goes 2-0, one win a pin over a 2-time state qualifier. Alyson goes 3-1 and finishes up 3 rd . Girls Team Place: 7 th out of 15
12/12	SA Reagan & SA Lee	DSHS 39 SA Reagan 42; DSHS 48 SA Lee 20 The Tigers drop another close one to San Antonio Reagan and get a convincing win over San Antonio Lee. Tony, Clayton, and Blake win both their matches by pin. In the Lee dual, Blake gets a first period fall over a giant who would go on to finish in the top 8 at 6A state. Dual Record: 8-5
12/15	Russ Pederson	The boys bring home their second team trophy of the year when they outscore the 6A Region 4 champs in San Antonio. Clayton smashes his way through another bracket and brings home the gold. Micah battles his way into the finals and takes 2 nd to the 6A state runner-up; he outplaces 3 eventual state qualifiers. Tony makes his way back into the finals, as well, dropping a one-point match to finish with the silver. Several others pick up multiple wins before elimination. On the girls' side, Cat finishes up 4 th after pinning a 6A qualifier in the consi semis, and Alyson gets a match away from the consi finals. Boys Team Place: 2 nd out of 33
12/22	Hill Country Classic	In the round robin tourney at Vista Ridge, the team nearly collects another trophy and claims too much hardware to summarize in paragraph form. 1 st : Clayton, Chase (he's back!) & Christian 2 nd : Alyson, Daniel & Michael G. 3 rd : Lauryn, Tony & Blake 4 th : Cody Wins over state placers: Chase & Clayton Wins over state qualifiers: Lauryn & Micah Boys Team Place: 3 rd out of 18
1/1-2	Texas Outlaw	The boys ring in the new year with a trip to Allen for the toughest tourney in the state. Chase goes 7-0, all pins, on his way to the championship and his first of several MOW awards. He pinslays an Oklahoma state runner up in the finals. Clayton storms to the finals for the second year in a row, majoring the 6A 4 th place wrestler from Allen in the semis before falling in the finals to an eventual Oklahoma runner up. He outplaces the eventual Georgia state champ. Colby is the only other Tiger to bring home some hardware; he places 6 th . Other notables: Micah beats an Oklahoma state placer on day one and finishes 7th, Luke takes out a returning state qualifier, and Tony finishes 9 th . Team Place: 9 th out of 24
1/11	State Duals	DSHS 42 El Paso Del Valle 33 ; DSHS 36 Highland Park 42; DSHS 60 RL Turner 24 ; DSHS 39 Lubbock 27 ; DSHS 33 Carrollton Creekview 36 The boys head back to El Paso for another crack at the state duals and repeat last year's finish of 4 th place. Pool play ends with the Tigers in a 3-way tie for first after an impressive win over Lubbock High, but the tiebreaker goes to Highland Park. The third place dual comes down to the final match but goes the way of Creekview. Tony and Clayton are undefeated on the day, but everyone comes to battle. A few highlights: Collins drops a 1-point decision to an eventual state placer in the HP dual, Brodie nearly upsets a state champ from Lubbock, Micah picks up a 6-2 win over an eventual state placer from Lubbock, and Matthew and Crystian both nearly get wins over eventual qualifiers. Team Place: 4 th out of 10 Dual Record: 10-6

1/12	Cavalier Classic	While the guys ride back from El Paso, Coach Hammond and the girls take a trip to that school up north and get some mat time of their own. Alyson makes her second consecutive final and claims silver, Cat gets the bronze, Lauryn takes 4 th , and Lillian finishes 5 th . All four girls pick up varsity wins. Girls Team Place: 6 th out of 11
1/16	SA Johnson, Churchill, & Lampasas	DSHS 43 SA Johnson 28; DSHS 21 Churchill 55; DSHS 60 Lampasas 24 The guys go 2-1 at the first ever quad meet hosted by DSHS. Daniel, Clayton, Chase, Michael H. and Tony are undefeated on the evening. Chase and Clayton get three falls each. One of Clayton's pins is in a team record 8 seconds. Micah's season ends versus Churchill when he tears his shoulder, ending a very promising run. Cat is 3-0 on the evening, all pins. Dual Record: 12-7
1/18-19	Tiger Classic	Instead of returning to Dallas Jesuit, the whole squad loads into a yellow dog for a trip to Houston this year. Chase rattles off four pins on his way to another gold medal and MOW award. Clayton picks up two pins and a decision on his way to a second –place finish behind the eventual 6A state bronze medalist. No other boys place. Cat pins her way in to the semifinals and then slides into a 6 th place finish. Alyson goes 4-2 on her way to a 4 th place finish and suffers a season-ending leg injury. Boys Team Place: 9 th out of 29
1/23	@ Georgetown + Pflugerville	DSHS 63 Pflugerville 12; DSHS 51 Georgetown 24 It's no fluke when the Tigers down both Georgetown and Pflugerville. Chase and Tony are the only two to get matches in both duals and win both. Colby Collins goes to his happy place and bests Clayton's 8-second fall from the week before with a 6-second fall, claiming the program record. Dual Record: 14-7
1/26	Black & Blue	The team heads down to Schertz for the final tourney before district, and the boys come home with another team trophy. Chase pins his way through another bracket and gets another gold. JJ takes out the first and fourth seeds before losing by a point in the finals in his best varsity performance to date. Tony drops a close semi and finishes up third. Brodie rallies back for third, too, after losing first round. Other notables: in his first varsity appearance, Zach dominates an eventual state qualifier and picks up a pin in overtime the next match; Colby has a solid 3-2 showing; and Jack gets his first varsity pin. The only girl left in the lineup at this point, Cat picks up four more pins on her way to a bronze medal. Boys Team Place: 2 nd out of 26
1/30	Westlake	DSHS 59 Westlake 11 On senior night, the guys smash Westlake. Tony goes out in style with a tech fall, Clayton picks up a quick throw to a pin, and Blake settles for a forfeit. Also picking up pins in the dual are Chase, JJ, and Justin. Final Dual Record: 15-7

2/2-6	District 13-5A Championships	<p>Although many outperform their seeds, the boys finish up second at district behind Leander Glenn. Ten guys wrestle for gold and two claim district titles: Chase and Clayton, the third district title for each of them. Solo Lady Tiger Cat also claims a district title. Brodie and Tony make the district finals for the second time in their careers. Cody, Daniel, Crystian, Luke, JJ, and Justin make their first finals appearances. Colby takes 4th and qualifies for regionals. Wrestling up from 195 to 285, Blake nearly makes it out, as well, but loses a tough challenge match. Cole takes 6th and contributes points to the team score.</p> <p>Boys Team Place: 2nd out of 13</p>
2/15-16	Region 4-5A Championships	<p>The Dirty Dozen 2.0 head back to the Delco one last time looking to earn spots at the state tournament, and seven survive the two days. Chase and Clayton both dominate their way to regional championships, Clayton's second and Chase's third. Chase is once again named the meet's most outstanding male wrestler. Brodie finishes up third, stamping his ticket to state in a revenge match versus the guy who beat him in the district finals. Tony barely misses the finals when he drops an OT match in the semis; he finishes up 4th and qualifies for state. Luke nearly makes the finals, as well, but drops a close semi and finishes up fourth to qualify for state. JJ picks up three big pins and a challenge match win to claim 4th and stamp his ticket to Houston. Cat single-handedly beats eleven other girls teams when she gets three falls on her way to a 4th place finish, earning a trip to state in her rookie season. Cat is the first ever girl to qualify for state for DSHS, and the boys team ties the program record of six qualifiers from 2017.</p> <p>Boys Team Place: 3rd out of 38</p>
2/22-23	State Championships	<p>At the Berry Center, the Savage Seven battle with the state's best for a place on the podium. Only Chase and Clayton survive day one; they both dominate their way into Saturday morning's semifinals. Tony picks up a major on the back side of the bracket before elimination to finish in the top 12 and complete his senior season with a spot in the top five of several single-season and career record categories. Luke also picks up a major in consol round one to finish in the top 12. On Saturday, Clayton picks up a quick pin to finish fifth after dropping a tough semi and consol semi. He ends his career as one of only three Tigers to reach the podium three times, and he now holds the program records for career wins, pins, and team points. Chase continues to dominate on Saturday and caps off an undefeated season with a pin in the state finals. He is named the most outstanding 5A boy out of all 14 state champions after pinning everyone in the first period and wrestling the equivalent of less than one match over the course of the tournament.</p> <p>Boys Team Place: 8th out of 90</p>
