Divergent by Veronica Roth; In this dystopian world, society is divided into five factions, each dedicated to the cultivation of a particular virtue.

Uglies by Scott Westerfeld; Tally's adventures begin in Uglies, where she learns the truth about what life as a Pretty really means.

Miles Morales Spiderman by Jason Reynolds; Miles Morales is just your average teenager, oh yeah, and he's SpiderMan.

Renegades by Marissa Meyer; The Renegades are a syndicate of prodigies who emerged from the ruins of a crumbled society and established peace and order where chaos reigned.
